Our FY 2019 – 2020 could easily be separated into two very distinct six-month periods. For the first six months beginning in September 2019, we continued our upward trend in job growth with a relatively tight labor market. That came to an abrupt halt in March 2020 due to the Coronavirus-19 pandemic.

Organizations in virtually all sectors of the economy had to alter business models seemingly overnight just to survive forced closures, less demand and much uncertainty in the marketplace. Various governmental initiatives on the local, state and national basis were unleashed in an attempt to mitigate the economic damage caused by the pandemic.

Year in Review

We continued our long standing practice of calling on resident businesses, inclusive of those firms with offices outside of Wicomico's jurisdictional border. Calling on our existing customers allows us to better understand the needs of our business community and to tailor programs and services to meet those needs. At the same time, we recognize that attrition will occur and attraction also needs to be a part of our initiatives.



We again attended events and connected with Site Location Consultants through various trade events and with corporate real estate executives through the Industrial Asset Management Council. We participated in a number of trade shows early in the year including the International Production and Processing Expo in Atlanta, the premier event for those communities with food processing as an important sector of their economy. In addition:

- Assisted Filtronic Comtek, a wireless component manufacturer located in the Northwood Industrial Park, in moving their manufacturing operation in China to Salisbury. The move created fifteen new jobs, solidified the company's presence here and established the firm's antenna distribution center.
- Within the same economic sector, we helped APEX rfc establish operations in Northwood. While job predictions were strong, the Coronavirus-19 pandemic has deferred APEX from establishing U.S operations at this time.
- In partnership with local governments and private sector businesses, SWED is assisting in the study of the Port of Salisbury. The objective is to understand current economic conditions and identify potential opportunities.
- We also began several site searches for local companies expanding operations.

Attention to Small Business

As a result of the pandemic's impact especially on small businesses, SWED pivoted from traditional roles in economic development to deliver assistance to those businesses most in need. Through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES), we deployed \$9 million to assist more than 900 small businesses throughout Wicomico County, Maryland.



Our strategy for the coming year is to capitalize on our assets, develop additional and innovative programs to target job growth and work collaboratively with our many partners for the betterment of all.
